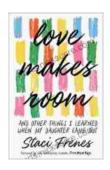

Our daughter's coming out journey has been a transformative experience for our family. Through love, acceptance, and education, we have navigated the challenges and celebrated the milestones together.

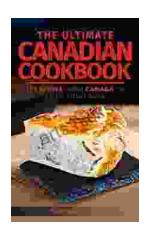

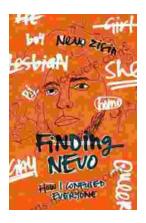
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
